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Mike Shor is an Associate Professor of Economics at the University of Connecticut. Mike's expertise is in behavioral economics and game theory. His research combines economics with psychology to understand how cognitive and social biases distort "optimal" human decision-making. He is the co-author of a leading textbook in managerial economics and his cross-disciplinary research has appeared in leading journals in economics, accounting, information systems, operations, and marketing. Mike has consulted for the Federal Trade Commission and has written expert testimony in numerous major antitrust, merger, and price-fixing cases. Previously, Mike was on the faculty at the Owen Graduate School of Management at Vanderbilt University where he was twice voted the best professor by the graduating MBA class.
